The FOCUS Foundation is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization which has established goals in the following areas:

- Granting funds to educators who spend money out of their pockets
- Encouraging students to read
- Presenting financial literacy topics to various groups in the community

The Foundation was formed in 2007 and since that time there has been over \$230,000 granted to educators in our community. Children and education are the passion of the Foundation.

The word FOCUS spelled out equals "For Our Children's Ultimate Success".

Where do the funds come from?

All of the FOCUS Foundation funds come from fundraisers with our staff and Board of Directors volunteering their time, efforts and suggestions.

The staff of Coastal Community And Teachers Credit Union went above and beyond to raise funds for the Howdy Daze free community event held at West Guth Park in April. Several teams raised over \$1,000.00. Those team members included:

All teams raised in excess of \$23,000. A great job done by great teamwork.

A local non-profit, all Four One Community, donated \$7,601.28 to the FOCUS Foundation during 2019. These funds will, in turn, be granted back out to the community to assist the youth.

Howdy Daze, our free community event in its 16th year of existence, was held in April. This year we had special guests "Dinos Live" and it brought the community out with over 1,500 in attendance. Visitors joined us and enjoyed the free food, entertainment, pony rides, petting zoo and vendors who gave out literature to educate our attendees. This event remains a favorite among the community and our employees.

Where do the funds go?

The funds are disbursed in grant forms to educators who show a need for an expense for their school or their students, playground equipment, library books and more. During 2019, we granted \$8,330 back to the schools in our six-county area.

The FOCUS Foundation continues to fill a void for these educators who applied for grants. The grant requires it be for an academic purpose. This, in turn, assists our educators in the classrooms which will enhance the learning of the children in our communities.

During 2019, we also awarded \$3,250 to Campus Champions. This was the FOCUS Foundation's way of saying "thank you" to those who may not always be recognized. These champions were

were nominated by their co-workers. It was very rewarding to see them accept gratitude for a job well done.

What else do the volunteers of the FOCUS Foundation do?

The FOCUS Foundation provides financial literacy presentations throughout schools and organization annually. The staff of Coastal Community And Teachers Credit Union regularly volunteer to present financial literacy programs. These topics include, but are not limited to, balancing your checkbook, all about savings, credit cards, lending, real estate loans, credit bureau reports, budgeting and our most popular, identity theft/fraud. The financial literacy education is presented at employer group meetings, parent meetings, in student classrooms, faculty meetings and more. Young Professionals at Coastal Community And Teachers Credit Union

The Young Professionals at Coastal Community And Teachers Credit Union held their second annual Kickball Tournament. The Tournament funds were to support the continued initiative of the Young Professionals – providing blessing bags for Mother Theresa's Homeless Shelter. For the past several years, the Young Professionals have taken these bags to this location on Thanksgiving Day. This year the Young Professionals delivered over 100 blessing bags to the Homeless shelter.

PARTNER – Summer Sports and Wellness Program

In 2014, the FOCUS Foundation was approached to partner with the Summer Sports and Wellness Program. A partnership directed by Raul Munoz, a Preferred Partner of Coastal Community And Teachers Credit Union and TAMUCC Department of Kinesiology.

In 2019, the program provided over 100 students from low-income households within Nueces County access to fitness activities, nutritional education, strategies for developing healthier lifestyles including financial literacy and diabetes education for prevention and mitigation. In addition, participants were exposed to a fun, caring and nurturing university environment.

Initially this was a federally funded program, but that funding was discontinued a few years ago. Hence, our program has become dependent on outside sources. The TAMU-CC Department of Kinesiology continues to host the program in their facilities. However, due to university policy as it relates to programs funded through outside entities, support was channeled through another non-profit organization. Hence, the partnership with the FOCUS Foundation.
